### **Agony Corner:**

For the benefit of those who were not at the July meeting, we reviewed some of the topics raised at that meeting (qv July email) before moving on to a couple of new ones.

- 1) 'I use Widows Live Mail (in Windows 7) and my 'Sent' folder has disappeared so I've no record of sent emails'.....
  - Your sent emails will still be there but somehow the sent folder or its icon has become hidden but there is a work around
  - In 'View' you can toggle between Compact views (icons) or Folders in the folder pain.
  - By default, top of the Folder pane is 'Quick views' and the 'Sent' items can be recovered here.....
  - In View, select 'Quick views' (or right click on the Quick view icon) and check the box that starts 'All sent items Shows all messages....', OK to close and a sent items folder will be in Quick views.
- 2) 'I'm noticing a lot more spam and potentially malicious email recently'...
  - Recent ones reported by members include emails purporting to confirm and thank you for an order you've made. It seems to have come from a legitimate source but you know you have not placed any orders with them. You are invited to open a file attachment (in zip form) and a mobile number is included for further information. *Do neither*. Just delete the email without further action.
  - Others offer a tax refund from HMRC by email and others saying you've won a lottery or a car, say (these also by post). Again delete without action.
  - This is a topic we've discussed many times before. Help and advice can be found by searching our archives on the web site.

## Topic for the day:
