 'Ninite Installer' which *Guarantees* that no unwanted add-ons are included. You can
 download and install or update several at a time if you wish. https://ninite.com/
- Create a fake virus to check the efficacy of your security software, <u>www.snipca.com/15896</u>, EICAgen. Explanatory article in Computer Active issue 447, 15-28th April.
- A regular recommendation, ADWcleaner, <u>www.snipca.com/12616</u> removes PuPs.
 Follow up with Malware Bytes get it via Ninite, above.

Please have a browse through all these as the knowledge gained will make you much better prepared for any pit falls ahead.
