Computing and Technology

e've had two meetings since the last newsletter, August and October. Whilst there were only 5 or 6 in attendance at each we had much fun and chatter in amongst our more technical discussions.

Including matters arising from the previous meetings and new topics we discussed (amongst others)...

August: In a very full meeting, once again we explored the various uses of the Windows 'Right Click' (context) menu, and then examined ways to get rid of, or at least minimise the problems October: Since the last meeting, we'd created by 'spam'.

This led on to 'How to avoid wanted emails going into spam/trash folders'. many ways to do this, but as we have discovered, they don't always work! A favourite solution is to make sure that the sender is in your contacts, but again we've found there are no guarantees. We further discussed- 'How to convert speech to text', 'Crop a picture to a shape in Power Point and Publisher'. 'How to share a folder in DropBox', 'When is 'www' needed?' (these days, hardly at all), 'How to prepare QR codes' - a right click option on any web page and finally, a reminder on how to 'Mail merge using Excel and Word.'

In preparation for the meeting one of our members had raised a question about storage folders and how to organise and use them to the best advantage. We used 'Windows Explorer' (now File Explorer) to delve into this. Having shown that pressing the Windows key +E opens a fresh window, we were able to explore all the viewing options and see how easy it was to move files and folders around. It seems that however experienced we are, there's always something new to learn!

February 15th. "Dad's Army" Charles Garland.


A fun, behind the scenes talk, with personal stories about the writers and cast from David Croft's assistant. It was H.M.
