April 18, Thursday - Walking Tour Historic Bury St Edmunds

If you consider yourself a history buff why not join us for this walking tour and you may see a different side of Bury St Edmunds.

We will meet in Bury St Edmunds at the **War Memorial on Angel Hill at 11.45am**. The tour starts at 12.00 noon and lasts an hour and a half and can take a maximum of 20 people. Each tour costs £120 and cost will be allocated according to the number who sign up.

If anyone requires a lift let us know.

Parking can be a bit tricky so allow enough time to park in order to arrive at the meeting on time. There's a carpark behind the Primark (formerly Debenhams) shopping centre or across the street behind the movie theatre complex.

We can have lunch or a beverage afterwards.

May 23, Thursday - Bressingham Gardens, Diss

We will meet in the **car park at 11.00am**. Entrance to the Gardens is **£7**; there is an honesty box, therefore please bring exact change, cash only. You are free to wander the gardens at your own leisure.

If you'd like to visit the **Steam Museum it's an additional £8.49**.

There is also a garden centre and large restaurant if you would like coffee/tea or lunch.

July 23, Tuesday - Sizewell B Tour

We will meet in the **car park at 12.45pm**. The visit is 3 hours, half of that, 1½ hours, is comprised of a tour. Security restrictions are in place and you must present a current driving license/passport for ID purposes; please let us know if you do not have either and we'll find out what other arrangements are possible. And you must be at least 11 years old (!)

Please note that the tour is physical, 1.65 miles total, and 190 steps, including open grated walkways at height.

All visitors are required to wear socks with sensible flat, secure, laced up boots or training shoes with grip on the sole. The footwear must cover the entire foot - legs and arms must be covered: all visitors are to wear full length trousers and a top with a full length sleeve. .

80% is outdoors so dress accordingly.

Please note the following rules:

No cameras will be permitted

No mobile phones

No other electronic devices

No food or drink on the tour

Lockers are available for visitors' small personal effects. However, if you do not need them, please leave these personal effects at home or locked in your vehicle . All visitors will be searched by a security guard on entering the station. You must keep to the designated route whilst on the tour. Your guide will look after you – make sure you know which guide is yours!

You will be required to wear the following:

Personal Protective Equipment - Hard hat - adjustable

Ear protection – ear plugs

Eye Protection - glasses

Hi Viz waistcoat - Gloves

Safety Shoes if yours are not suitable

We can book up to 42 (dependent on the number of guides available) with one guide for every 6 of us.

There is **NO CHARGE** for this visit and travel by own transport (car share can be arranged)
